

*Trainees must be able to practice medicine in a way that ensures the provision of **safe** patient care, including on call, in which major patient issues are identified and managed appropriately. By the end of the PEAP period trainees must be able to meet expectations in the following domains:*

#### Medical Expertise

- To appropriately recognize, determine a differential diagnosis for, work up, and provide a safe management plan for patients with:
  - Respiratory failure (including recognition of need for intubation, management of ARDS)
  - Sepsis
  - Shock of different etiologies
  - Neurologic emergencies (including intracranial bleeding, seizures, and decreased level of consciousness)
  - Kidney and liver failure
  - Toxidromes and severe metabolic derangements
  - Cardiac arrest
  - The deteriorating patient

#### Procedural Expertise

- To independently perform and be able to judge when the following is necessary:
  - Central venous line - IJ and femoral
  - Dialysis line insertion - IJ and femoral
  - Arterial line insertion - radial and femoral
  - Intubation of anticipated straightforward airways in hemodynamically stable and unstable patients
  - Recognition of the difficult airway and appropriate escalation for help

#### Leadership and Supervision Capacity

- To be able to lead rounds with minor support or redirection
- To provide appropriate and safe management of emergent scenarios and resuscitation as a team leader (e.g. cardiac arrest, unplanned extubation, massive hemorrhage) with appropriate escalation
- To triage calls effectively while ensuring that all patients are seen in a timely fashion
- To be able to supervise junior learners in patient care and procedures

## Professionalism, Communication, and Collaboration

- Fellows are expected to do the following:
  - Call attendings appropriately for help, providing appropriate information and formulating a preliminary impression and plan for patients
  - Identify the need for and call consultants appropriately
  - Exhibit a professional attitude towards their clinical and other work, including (but not limited to) demonstrating punctuality, responsiveness to calls, timely review and assessment of patients, collegial interactions with all members of the healthcare team, and responsibility towards patients
  - Communicate effectively, efficiently, and collegially with all members of the healthcare team
  - Establish a patient's SDM and provide updates to family members
  - Properly document daily assessments and care plans, patient consultations, patient follow-ups, procedures, family meetings, and other discussions regarding patient care
  - Seek out and incorporate feedback, demonstrate work and improvement on identified areas for growth, and demonstrate insight and humility
